

## Consultation on investigating deaths during compulsory treatment/care

## Online events

On 8 December 2021, the Mental Welfare Commission for Scotland (the Commission) <u>published a consultation document</u> setting out its proposals for a new system for investigating the deaths of people who, at the time of their death, were in compulsory treatment or care for a mental health condition or learning disability. The proposals also cover individuals whose period of compulsory treatment / care ended within 28 days of their death.

Views on the proposals can be submitted until Tuesday 15 February 2022 through the <u>online response form</u>, and responses will be analysed by independent researchers, Griesbach & Associates (Dawn Griesbach and Jennifer Waterton).

Alongside the consultation, Griesbach & Associates are also arranging two online events to provide information about the proposals and to give people an opportunity to discuss them. The events will be held on:

- Tuesday, 18 January 2022, 7pm: This event is intended for family members/carers of a person with a mental health condition or learning disability, or those who provide family / carer support services. Family members/carers may also bring along a supporter.
- **Tuesday 25 January 2022, 4pm**: This event is intended for people working in health and social care services, including third sector services.
