The landlord can be a person or a local authority or a housing association



Your **landlord** is who owns your house and you pay rent to.




Your tenancy agreement will also say what you have to do to keep your house.



Changes can only be made to your agreement if both you and the landlord agree and it is written down and signed.

## What information will be in your tenancy agreement?



Your tenancy agreement will say the name of your landlord.




Your tenancy agreement will say the address of the house or flat you are renting.





Your tenancy agreement will say the date that you get to move into the home.

You can have other members of your family live with you as long as it is not too many people.
Anyone living in or visiting the home must look after it.
This includes keeping it clean.
This means not causing damage to the home or any parts that are shared with neighbours.
You must make sure to do what you can to stop fires or floods from happening.

You should make sure to let air in from outside by opening the windows sometimes.
If you have a garden you must look after it.
You should tell your landlord if you are going to be staying somewhere else for a while.
This would usually only be if you were going to be away for a long time.
You should speak to your landlord if you want to start running a business from home.

The landlord might have to agree
before you can do it.
There are rules about how many
people can live together.
Talk to your landlord before
someone else moves in with you or if
you have had a baby.
They may help you to move to
somewhere bigger if you need to.
You should check with your landlord
before you get a pet.


Your landlord might tell you about things you need to do in shared parts of the home.

## Moving someone else in or if you move out



You might need to tell your landlord if someone moves in with you.



You will need to tell your landlord if you want to swap homes with someone else.



The landlord will need to approve any changes to who lives in the house.



You will need to tell your landlord if you want to move out.



You should usually tell them 28 days before you move.

Your landlord needs to make sure your home is safe to live in.



Your landlord must make sure that repairs to the building are done.




Your landlord will not repair your personal belongings .



Your landlord might charge you for repairs if the damage was caused by you.

	Your landlord will make sure that gas appliances like your boiler are inspected.

Ending the tenancy	

	If you want to move and end the tenancy you must tell your landlord.
	If your landlord wants you to move out before the end of your tenancy agreement this is called an eviction.
× × ×	They cannot do this without a good reason.  They can only evict you if you break the rules of the tenancy agreement.
	The landlord has to give you a written warning.
COURT HOUSE MINE HINE	The landlord would have to go to court first.



Your right to information	
	You have the right to ask to see any information your landlord has about you.
Report	Your landlord should publish information every year about how well they have been doing including their accounts.  You will be able to see these.
complaints policy	Your landlord has to publish a complaints procedure.
Complaints Policy	This means you will know how to make a complaint if you need to.
easy read and the second and the sec	You can ask for information about how the housing service is run.

# Your right to have your say If your landlord is making changes to policies that might change things for you they will ask your views. This includes changes to the amount 2022 2023 2024 2025 of rent you pay. Report Your landlord will have something called a tenant participation strategy This is a plan for how they will make sure to involve their tenants in how they run their organisation. You can ask for a copy of this.



Your landlord should make sure that when they are consulting, they make this accessible.

#### Signing a tenancy agreement



Do not sign your agreement until you are sure you understand what you are agreeing to.



Once you sign this is a legal agreement between you and the landlord.
