What the Commission does

People from the Mental Welfare Commission visit people in hospitals and other places.

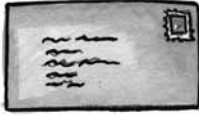
The Commission looks into cases when they think there is a problem with how you or someone else is being treated.
