Quarterly report to the MWC on admissions of young people to non-specialist wards.

This report is to be made retrospectively on admissions of young people under the age of 18 for treatment of mental disorder to adult mental health, paediatric and general hospital wards. *(Please see notes below).*

The Commission does not need to be informed of admissions of young people that are:

- **less than 24 hours in duration or**
- **a result solely of substance misuse.**

Reporting periods relate to admissions that begin on dates:

1 April - 30 June

1 July - 30 September

1 October - 31 December

1 January - 31 March

All ADM3 reports should be sent to the Commission within 28 days of the end of any reporting period.

Notes:

Admission Date is defined as the date that a young person's care commences in a ward.

Discharge Date is the date of discharge or transfer of the young person from that non-specialist ward.

If a young person has been placed in a succession of non-specialist wards during a single admission episode (eg general adult ward and then IPCU and then general ward) then an entry should be made detailing the duration of stay on each non-specialist ward during that single admission episode.

If patients are still patients within non-specialist wards at the end of any given reporting period please identify these patients and provide details of their admission episode on subsequent ADM3 reports.
